



Looking for a simple but effective vocabulary routine to help your students improve their comprehension and word choice while writing?




This resource includes everything you need to implement a Word of the Day or Words of the Week vocabulary routine in your classroom!



Step One:

Use the digital slides to predict and discuss. What does this word mean? Have you heard it before?

Prefer not to use the digital component? No problem! Simply discuss the word orally with your class.




Step Two:

Post the word cards on your vocabulary board or a piece of chart paper, where they will stay for the week.

Have students use the new words to write sentences or paragraphs; add the sticky notes to the vocabulary area.



As an alternative to the sticky note option, have students use the included activity sheets or digital word of the day slides to work with the new words.



Step Three:

Use the words throughout the week in your classroom!

Use them in your teaching if possible and encourage your students to use them in their writing.






